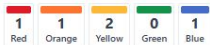

AVID Program

AVID is a **4 year program/commitment** that prepares students to attend a four year university. AVID's mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college and career readiness and success in a global society.

*98% of 2024 seniors were accepted to 4 year colleges

*93% of AVID students (2020) graduated from a 4 year college

AVID provides SAT/ACT prep, college application review, FAFSA application support, personal statement review, tutoring in AVID class and outside of class, study skills, test taking skills, organizational skills and more.

AVID only works if the student is determined to put in the effort. AVID focuses on the importance of an education by helping students become empowered. Students are expected to maintain a GPA of B or higher, take college prep courses, join clubs, complete community service, participate in tutoring and learn to communicate with teachers.

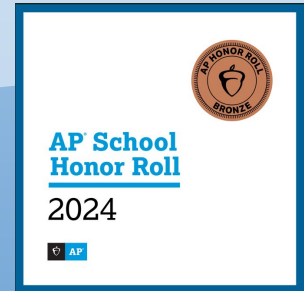
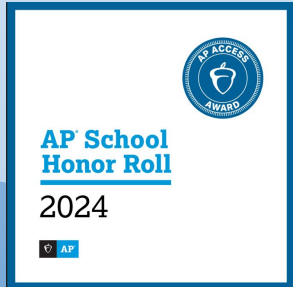

Enhanced, AP, and IB Courses

49% of students in the graduating class who took an AP exam at any point in high school

37% of students in the graduating class who scored 3+ on any AP Exam in high school.

13% of students in the graduating class who took 5 or more AP Exams in high school, where at least 1 exam was taken in 9th or 10th grade.

IB Diploma Programme



The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) is a nonprofit educational foundation established in 1968. IB helps develop the intellectual, personal, emotional and social skills to live, learn and work in a rapidly globalizing world.

- IB Diploma students take six core subjects, additionally they write a 4000 word extended essay, complete Theory of Knowledge and CAS (Creativity, Activity and Service).
- Minimum of 3 Higher level (HL) classes (Max is 4). The rest of the classes in Standard level.
- To earn the IB Diploma students must get at least 24 points total on HL & SL course exams and successfully complete TOK, EE, CAS.



CTE Pathways

What is CTE?

- The **Career Technical Education** (CTE) program in the Newport-Mesa Unified School District offers elective courses in a sequential CTE pathway, within an industry sector that incorporates science, math, English Language Arts (ELA), and CTE common core standards
